No more than two courses with the same prefix may be used to complete Distribution Groups E-I. All students must complete at least one laboratory course in the Natural Science Group. All students will complete 3 designated Writing Across the Curriculum (W) courses in addition to the ENG1112 and ENG3313 sequence with at least 1 UD; complete 3 designated Information Literacy (I) courses with at least 2 UD; complete 3 designated Global Awareness (G) courses, with the following exceptions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Students who transfer in 31-60 credits must complete two “W”, two “I”, and two “G” courses. At least one “W” course must be at the upper level. Students who transfer in 61 or more credits must complete one “W”, one “I”, and one “G” course. At least one “W” and one “I” course must be at the upper level.
